Wanted poster- Create a wanted poster for a character in your novel. Be sure to include a physical description, why the character is wanted, a picture, and a ransom.	Journal- Pretend you are a character in the novel and write a 1 page journal entry from their perspective relating to anything from the story.	New ending- Did you like the ending of the novel? If not, write at least a 1 page new ending to the novel, taking it in any direction you wish! Remember to write the ending as if you are picking up where the author left off.	Scrapbook page- Designate a page in your notebook where you cut and paste pictures, words, and quotes that relate to your book. Be sure to include at least a paragraph explaining why you chose the items on the scrapbook page.
